## About Dayanut

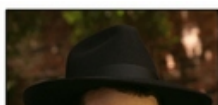

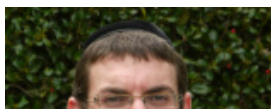

**Michael J. Broyde** is a professor of law and the academic director of the Law and Religion Program at Emory University. He is also a senior fellow in the Center for the Study of Law and Religion at Emory University. Broyde has published more than 70 articles on various aspects of law and religion and Jewish law, and a number of articles in the area of federal courts. He is ordained as a Modern Orthodox rabbi by Yeshiva University and is a member (dayan) of the Beth Din of America, the largest Jewish law court in America. He gives an Even

Haezer shiur four times a week as part of a new Dayanut kollel in Atlanta.

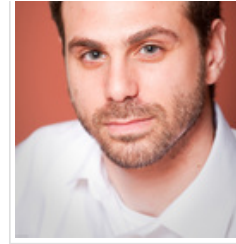


Rabbi Avi Shlomo is a member of the Atlanta Dayanut Institute. 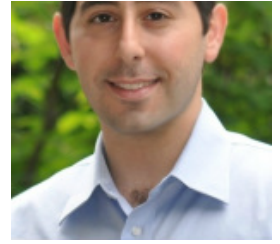
Education coordinator at Chabad/Beth Tefillah.



Rabbi Sender Lustig received his rabbinical ordination from Rabbi Yitzchok Y. Yeruslavsky, Chief Rabbi of the Israeli city of Kiryat Malachi. His education continued through post-rabbinic work at the Kollel's Halachic Research Program, located in Brooklyn. During that period he also taught an in depth Talmud class at the Chovevey Torah Talmudic seminary.



Ira Bedzow is a graduate student at Emory University with a Doctorate in Philosophy and Religion. He is Project Director for Moral Education at Emory. He is the author of *Halakhic Man, Authentic Jew: Modern Expressions of Orthodox Thought, a comparative study of Rabbis Soloveitchik and Berkovits*, and *Things Overheard in the Synagogue*, a collection of poetry.
